The historic tradition of Mayor Making took place in May, with Cllr. Ivan Henderson invested for a second year as Mayor of Harwich, supported by his wife, Cllr. Jo Henderson as Mayoress, with Cllr. Maria Fowler accepting the position of Deputy Mayor. High Steward, Chris Strachan joined in with the historic tradition of throwing Kitchels from the windows of the Guildhall to excited children from local schools.

Crowds packed Harwich Quay celebrating Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II's reign of 70 years. The weekend will be

Along with the celebrations on the Quay, Harwich marked this moment in history of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, joining with many of the coastal towns around Great Britain to light the Jubilee Beacon. The Harwich beacon was one of 1500 beacons lit on the
