


ALLOTMENT NEWSLETTER

If you feel you can offer your time and support to the committee in this role, please forward a letter of interest giving brief details of why you would like the position.



Bonfires

Members of HTC Allotments Committee have agreed that the winter month timings for lighting of bonfires as of September 2022 is to include the month of February.

Winter Timings: October to February -After 1500hrs

Summer Timings: March to September –After 1800hrs



How to Reduce the Need to Water

Dig in or mulch with plenty of organic matter; this will help to retain moisture in the soil.

- Apply mulches when the soil is warm and moist, this will reduce water loss due to evaporation and also suppress weeds.
- Weeds compete for moisture and nutrients in the soil so weed regularly or cover soil with a weed suppressing geo-textile. The weeds, roots and all can be composted if processed correctly by drowning in water or put in a black plastic bag in the sun until they decompose. Weed seeds will only be destroyed in the hot compost process.
- Grow crops that suit your local conditions. A greenhouse or poly-tunnel can increase the need for water significantly so water harvesting from these structures is Important.

Black Plastic Ground Covering

Black plastic covering has proved very helpful with controlling weed growth and managing the areas of a plot not currently being cultivated.

The 500g black polythene plastic sheeting which comes in a width of 4 metres and is sold in lengths of 5 metres (20 square metres) is offered by Harwich Town Council at a very competitive cost of £8.60 per 20sqm.

WILDFLOWERS

Please note, you are required to seek permission from the council to grow wildflowers on your plot. They must be located in the centre of the plot, in a raised bed, no larger than 2m x 2m if you have a 10-rod plot or 1m x 1m if you have a 5 -rod plot.
